



Grant Guidelines

Overview

Camphill Foundation funds activity that addresses the challenges of people living with developmental, cognitive, behavioral, and psychological disabilities. If you are committed to using techniques of curative education and social therapy, community living, sustainable agriculture, and arts-based approaches, a grant from Camphill Foundation can help you learn and adapt the highly effective models of care that have emerged from the Camphill Movement and its communities.

Camphill Foundation's grant making supports nonprofit organizations in the United States as well as nongovernmental organizations abroad.

Eligibility

Camphill Foundation does not make grants to individuals. Successful grant applicants will typically have:

- Two year history of providing care for persons living with cognitive, developmental and psychological disabilities
- 501(c)(3) status or equivalent international standing
- Annual operating budget of more than \$50,000 (international applicants differ)
- Receive funding from mixed sources (e.g. government, individuals, foundations and corporations)
- Updated 990 (if operating in the U.S for more than one year)
- One hundred percent board financial commitment
- Board of Directors with representation from the community served

Institutional Grants:	\$5,000 - \$50,000
Average number of grants per year:	Five

Granting Cycle:

September 1st – October 15th: Letter of Intent Accepted

December 15th: Selected Applicants invited to submit proposals

February 1st: Deadline for proposal, all attachments and supporting documents

March 1st – April 1st: Site visit and discussion of evaluation process, if required.

June 1st: Professional Development Scholarship, Research Fellowship and Non-Profit / Non-Governmental Organizations Awardees are notified. All awardees must return the acknowledgement form. Non-Profit/Non-Governmental Organizations must also return an evaluation plan.

July 1st: Grants are awarded.

January 15th: Mid- year reports due from all awardees.

Additional Guidelines for Grants

- Because each grantee is different, Camphill Foundation works with each grantee to design an evaluation process that meets our goal to create nurturing and caring communities.
- Applicants are encouraged to visit current and former grantees prior to submitting a letter of intent.
- We are a small foundation and we encourage you to seek funding from other sources to support the work of anthroposophy, curative education, community living, social therapy and sustainable agriculture.
- All grantees must mention the Camphill Foundation on their website, in their newsletter, social media networks and annual report.
- Multi-year grants (up to five years) are contingent upon submission of annual evaluation reports
